

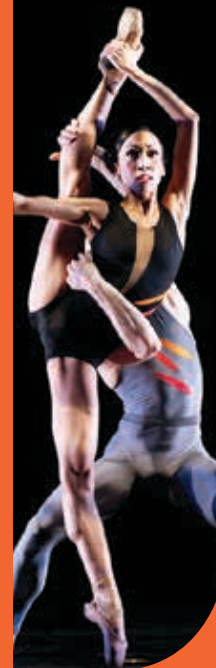

I am pleased to bring you this preview of the 2014 Virginia Arts Festival! This year we have some truly extraordinary firsts to share. We were thrilled to commission a new orchestral score for the epic silent film *Ben-Hur*, from percussionist and composer **Stewart Copeland** — familiar to millions as the drummer from *The Police*. We are excited to begin a three-year performance residency program with the legendary **Dance Theatre of Harlem**, whose triumphant return to the stage has made headlines. And we are honored to present the world premiere performance of composer **Adolphus Hailstork's** moving musical setting of Walt Whitman's *When Lilacs Last in the Dooryard Bloom'd*.

Virginia International Tattoo, presented this year as a signature event of the United States Vietnam War Commemoration, will honor Vietnam veterans and their families with its patriotic and majestic display of music and might. We'll hear jazz from the classic to the cutting edge with vocalist **Nnenna Freelon** and pianist **Chick Corea**, and experience the rock classics at **Music of Led Zeppelin** with wonderful arrangements enhanced by the Virginia Symphony Orchestra. We will be swaying with the husband and wife musical phenoms **Béla Fleck and Abigail Washburn** as they strum away on their banjos then swinging to the tunes of **Big Bad Voodoo Daddy**.

For music lovers, there's a wealth of unforgettable experiences in store, including the fabled **Israel Philharmonic Orchestra**, the brilliant violinist **Joshua Bell**, and the vocal perfection of the **Tallis Scholars**. A jewel among these musical riches will be a rare performance of the 17th-century chamber opera **Actéon**, conducted by early music master **William Christie**.

We look forward to sharing this bounty of great performances with you!
